



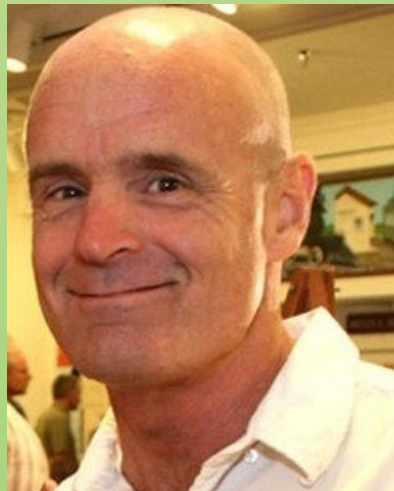
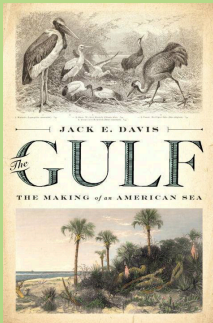

Dr. Jack E. Davis is a professor of environmental history and sustainable studies at the University of Florida. He is the author or editor of several books on Florida, including *The Gulf: The Making of an American Sea*, which won the 2017 Kirkus Prize for Nonfiction.
